KÖME – Association of Cultural Heritage Managers is a community of people working in heritage-related fields in Hungary. KÖME is an organisation that has been dealing with bottom-up heritage making since 2012. We create discourse platforms on heritage, promoting a holistic ecological mindset and collaborative, horizontal work structures.

One of our focus activities has become Internép in People's Theatre street of Budapest, which we do in close collaboration with the transdisciplinary artist group Pneuma Szöv.

Internép is an emerging heritage institution in the 8th district. It has been launched in October 2023 by us. Internép aims to develop this historically rich area by safeguarding its heritage and empowering inhabitants as active agents of heritigisation combined with a strong ecological, environmentally conscious approach.

Some of KÖME's project related activities:

Heritage & art: We work with artists, art organizations and art education institutions on a regular basis. We also work for fostering cooperation between artists and

heritage institutions, or creation processes where heritage values become a starting point for exciting artistic work. Our long-term collaboration partner is <a href="Pneuma Szöv.">Pneuma Szöv.</a>, with whom we have developed <a href="TV Free Europe">TV Free Europe</a>, a network of partners from 5 countries joining forces in a common retro-futuristic tele-theatre channel actualising and questioning the System Changes of 1989.

<u>Ecological heritage</u>: Amongst our members and partners there are many who work with nature protection and natural heritage. For KÖME it's especially important to convey traditional and contemporary ecological knowledge, so that they become part of our everyday practices. Lately we have worked with a peat bog near Budapest, for which we conceived a theme trail.

<u>Work with communities</u>: We cooperate regularly with municipalities, citizen groups, educational organizations and institutions to prepare decisions, strategies or to actualize concrete programs.

<u>Interpretation</u>: Heritage interpretation transforms phenomena into experiences, it opens up meanings and correlations connected to them, inspires to think, involves different views and encourages action. KÖME mixes the holistic view of heritage interpretation with our experiences of ecological embeddedness. We are members of the international network of Interpret Europe, in collaboration with which we have developed certified training on different areas of heritage interpretation.

Building Népszínház (People's Theatre) means acting and interacting on the basis of an artistic approach in creative, open and collaborative ways with other people and non-human entities in order to develop our identities and a sustainable and livable common future.

We wanted to adopt a participatory practice to get a basis for building up a network, a system of collaboration through different resource and asset sharing based platforms in the Népszínház street to involve people with different backgrounds in the artistic, collaborative development of the street.

# 11 April 2024- Népszínházvíziós találkozó #1 (People's Theatre Visionary meeting #1)

Where: it took place Internép Café (the living lab location)

With whom: local municipality, civil organisations, cultural and creative actors, socio-cultural institutions, changemakers, cultural places of the neighbourhood Main goals: The aim was to make the participants feel good, to break out of the habitual patterns of thinking and to look and see with different eyes. This meeting was an exercise, a proposal for cooperation, a zero step that we have taken together. The essence of People's Theatre for us is to do something together, just as the essence of theatre for us is to collaborate. We wanted to revive the spirit of the People's Theatre together at the workshop. So the aim was rather to release social energy, and this can even have a strong effect on change.

Activities: Agenda of the workshop (timing and activities)

9:30-10:00 arrival (each participant had to give a new name to him/her which is valid in the People's Theatre)

10:00-10:15: short intro of the roots of People's Theatre

10:15-10:30: Individual 'speed research' of the street according to drew action cards

10:30-11:00: creating narratives from the observations in small groups

11:00-11:45: Developing action proposals, which can be realized together with all the participants

11:45-12:00 coffee break

12:00 - 12:30 where anything can happen - exercise to realize one from the concrete proposals together

12:30 - 13:00: Feedback and collecting ideas for the continuation

Types of activities proposed: action research, workshop, discussion, intervention We developed our own methods considering the aims and time limits of the meeting. Among others the activities based on a card game, action research, cadavre exquis, mental mapping and storytelling.

Tools (technological or not): Block-Block-Block card, coloured papers, post it papers, flipchart, clips, rope, pens, poster paper, smartphone for voice recording Outputs: 3 ideas for small actions related to the street, new contacts and relationships, one realized action, foundation of the Népszínházvíziós network, creation of an email group.

# 2 July 2024 - Népszínházvíziós találkozó #2 (People's Theatre Visionary meeting #2)

Where: it took place Lehetőségek tere (The Space of Opportunity),

With whom: was involved local municipality, civil organisations, cultural and creative actors, socio-cultural institutions, changemakers, cultural places of the neighbourhood. New members were added as well.

Main goals To explore the challenges of the network members and where they can find common ground and help each other. This was a bit more of a "getting to know you" session, as there is so much they haven't managed to learn about each other, to form an organisational community, from which more can grow.

With whom: local municipality, civil organisations, cultural and creative actors, socio-cultural institutions, changemakers, cultural places of the neighbourhood. New members were added as well.

Main goals: To work out concrete plans for cooperations between the members of the network.

Main goals: According to the agreement between the leader of the knitting circle and us, they can use our space to organize workshops for free and they contribute to our street celebration with handcrafts. We use their materials to compile a theatre curtain which will appear on different points of the street during the feast. The aim of this workshop was to produce the handcrafts.

Types of activities proposed- handcraft workshop

Tools (technological or not): knitting tools

#### 15 October 2024 - Kis Varsó memorial

Where: it took place Internép, Népszínház street

With whom: The leader of the Reader's Circle and KÖME

Main goals: According to the agreement between the leader of the reader's circle and us, they can use our space to organize the circle for free and they contribute to our street celebration with ideas, inspiration and active participation. One of their ideas was to commemorate a special antifascist event which happened in the street on 15-18 October 1944. This countrywide unique resistance action was almost forgotten. The aim of this workshop was to co-create a small intervention to raise the attention of the people on the street.

Types of activities proposed- reading out an article of a historian on the memory of the event, co-creating the concept of the intervention, intervention

### 30 August 2024 - Cooperation workshop with TransHerit project

Where: it took place Internép, Népszínház street

With whom: The member of TransHerit project from Vienna and KÖME

Main goals: TransHerit and Internép are going to collaborate in the Népszínház street next year. The main goal of the workshop was to introduce our approach and creative principles to the project members to be able to plan together activities to help the TransHerit research with our contribution later.

## 22 August 2024, 19 September 2024- Internép Café 'Vendég Látás' (2 occasions)

Where: it took place Internép, Micropark (parklet in front of Internép)
With whom- involved artists, musicians from the neighborhood, hosted by the concept owner Gábor Rejtő

Main goals: The aim of this regular performative event is to find possible collaborators, members of our Internép concept. Everyone can come and play music, sing, read out poems or do anything interesting just for fun. Gábor Rejtő starts the event with some own songs each time. The long term goal is to establish a unique event which can regularly contribute to the financial sustainability of the place Activities:

19.00-22.00: introduction and actual line-up

Types of activities proposed- performances, light painting, decoration Tools (technological or not): mixer, speaker, microphone, instruments, lights, projectors

# Internép Café every month Megmozdulás a Népszínházban (Movement in Népszínház street, 6 occasions) (12., 19., 26. September, 2., 9., 16., 23. October)

Where: it took place Internép, Népszínház street

With whom: Beatrix Simkó contemporary dancer and choreographer, everybody who comes

Main goals: The aim of this movement workshop series is to collect inspirations and develop performative interventions in the street, focusing on free dance, framed by the relationship between the city and movement. Through movement, we explore the urban environment, our situatedness - the dynamics of the individual and the community, the relationship between inside and outside. We scan the past of the neighbourhood and make it our own. Through improvisation exercises we respond to what we experience. We move from individual observations to collective compositions as we transform everyday moments into dance. The results will be built in the annual street celebration.

artists, musicians from the neighborhood, members of the previous events of Internép (e.g. Fonalflanc (Knitting workshop) members, TransHerit project members, Megmozdulás a Népszínházban (Movement in Népszínház street) workshop participants)

### Main goals:

- To celebrate the Népszínház (People's Theatre) in the street
- To start an annual tradition
- to integrate every participant of the past events actively in one festivity
- to work artistically on the strengthening of the cohesion between the people in the neighbourhood
- giving the opportunity to everybody to experience the liberating power of art
- to let people contribute to the festivity with anything they can

21st of October: Bird Watching - Pneuma TV Party / Madár les - TV Party a Pneuma Szöv.-vel: watching videos of the past actions of Pneuma Szöv. in the district, discussion with the artists, party

25th of October: 'Season Opening' (incl. Strange bird parade, Movement in Népszínház street showing, 'Ki Mit Tudna? / Who would know what?' talent show

Where: STEREO Workshop, 1083 Budapest Illés utca 36.

With whom: local municipality, civil organisations, cultural and creative actors, socio-cultural institutions, changemakers, cultural places of the neighbourhood

Main goals: To work out the first version of the 'library of things' and to brainstorm on the legal establishment of the 'public cultural roundtable' of the district, which would give the possibility to the network to formally influence the local policymaking.

 How did you identify your stakeholders? Do you think the living Lab methodology assisted you in developing meaningful relationships with stakeholders? Describe how you maintain these relationships.

The Living Lab methodology helped us more in the development of the People's Theatre Visionary meetings. As we have had the 4th such workshop we could go much further on the cooperation of the members. We could already develop a common tool to share things among us. This tool will be maintained together under the moderation of Internép in the future.

 Describe any unforeseen challenges that have occurred in your living Lab activities. How did you solve these?

The biggest challenge was foreseeable and we could only partly solve it this year. The full participatory process needed a lot of capacity which the founding team had only to a limited extent. We tried to give a lot of space to people to do things together. And we tried to insist on curatorial concepts as little as possible. Hopefully it will be better next year.

- Library of things:

A developing database has been built up in the coordination of Internép for the use of the Népszínházvíziós network. It contains different type of resources which can

be shared among the members of the network, to increase capacities and avoid financial exchanges, spendings.

- Népszínház season opening feast:

A regular, annual event (series) has been launched by Internép. Its main goal is to channel in every initiatives, connections, resources and results around Internép at one moment of the year, and to catalyze new cooperations among the members of the neighbourhood. It functions as the summary of the previous year and as the founder of the next one.

- People's Theatre Visionary network:

The Internép team established an informal growing network of the local actors with two-monthly physical meetings (mostly workshop formats) and other communication channels. The main goal is to practice solidarity and cooperation.

The most important value of the project is the first stage of the local network including the mapping of sharable resources, practices of common act.

## 6. Reflection and conclusions

Please describe the added value of participatory practices according to your Living Lab experience

Participatory practices served as the basis of the development of the new space we just launched. They contributed to the capacity building of the team, to the social integration of the space and our work and to the mapping of the needs, norms, behaviours, approaches and in general the paralelly existing cultures of the neighbourhood.

### Please summarise your Key Findings

Some of the key findings on the mapping: people behave more directly on the street, they react more easily to happenings, they can connect more but in very different ways and signs. Greening and the alternative use of public space / street is a conflicting cause.

Some of the key findings on the capacity building: we could engage many people on different levels, even on the highest level (ownership). The core team of the space is much bigger now.

The social integration of the space: the perception of the space is more diverse now after the living lab process. The exact role, operation and function of Intenép is still a bit mysterious and confusing for people, but the acceptation of what we do and how we approach the neighbourhood is more positive.

Inputs for future directions and new cycles (what will you do differently? What was the main lesson learned that you will not do again!?

We need to do more deep and divers mapping of the street in cooperation with other interested entities (e.g. who are the users of the street?, how many of them live here? How and for what do they use the street? etc.)

We must communicate more about our visions and activities.

The children's summer camp is a big question. We are not sure if we would do it again, however there are people in the team who are very motivated.

We need to focus on the activisation of some of the members of the Népszínházvisionary network to keep the compilation of the group as diverse as possible.

Describe how you see the Long-term sustainability of your project and possibilities for scaling Up

As for the sustainability of the living lab intentions we need more time to think about and develop the financial sustainability. Part of it is to establish non-financial means and to keep the financial traffic as low as possible (e.g. to limit the crowdfunding to certain events or actions).

What recommendations would you give another similar organisation for potential replication of the Living Lab methodology?

The KPIs are very important to figure out for two reasons: 1. To fix and record your own expectations from a timewise framed process of your operation. 2. To be able to evaluate your achievements after a certain period to develop further.
